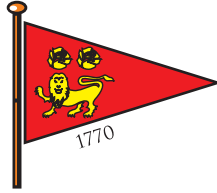

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REFLECTIONS



Sadly, during my term as commodore of Lough Ree Yacht Club, two of my predecessors, Lola Leech and John Berchmans Hannin, have passed away. Their great service to this club and indeed the general sailing world deserves to be remembered.

From the time I first arrived in the club in the early seventies, Lola, together with other former commodores since also gone from us - Peter Mulvihill (1979-1981), Jimmy Reid (1983-1984) and Syd Shine (1965-1973) - was a constant presence in the club. The club then had no cruiser class, just Shannon One Designs and Optimists. The facilities were very basic, including outside toilets with no roof. At regatta time every year, negotiations would take place with the local farmer to rent the field north of the club for parking and tents (posh people had caravans; really posh people had motor cruisers). The old boat shed was converted into a bar for the week by means of an

'occasional license' from 'The Thatch'. All this was a rather obvious contrast to today's situation.

While I have very fond memories of those times, my most vivid recollection is of being wet each day from early to late. Even then, despite the limited facilities, visiting clubs and classes always enjoyed their stays and always commented on the hospitality afforded them.

In 1976 Lola broke the mould by becoming the first lady commodore in Ireland. She held the office for three years, returning again in 1993 for a further two years. She also became one of the club trustees. Her unwavering commitment to the club, from childhood to the end of her long life, is an example to us all. She was wise and dignified, listened well, but was firm when she had to be. It speaks volumes for her influence that John Leech is the current commodore of Lough Derg Yacht Club and Garrett Leech is likely to be commodore of this club by year's end.

The eighties saw the first major changes in my time in the club, when the cruiser class was re-instituted as a class. This added a new dynamic that widened the membership and introduced fresh ideas. Integration was swift with Berchs Hannin becoming commodore in 1988. Berchs enjoyed his sailing and was particularly adept at introducing new people to the sport. Our current bosun, John McGonigle - now an avid sailor with the same passion - recently told me that but for Berchs he would probably never have set foot on a sailing boat.

The nineties were my missing years, and I did not really know Michael Farrell (1996-1997) at all. Dr Joe Groarke (1995) I always remember for his wry sense of humour. Other memories I have of these commodores are of Jimmy Reid's successful effort to reinvigorate junior sailing; Syd Shine's sing-a-longs with a row of G&Ts lined up along the length of the piano; and any conversation with Peter Mulvihill that started with the words 'young man', which meant that I'd really screwed up.

I remember all these diverse personalities with affection and immense gratitude. Their commitment and loyalty to this club, together with their vision and achievements, are an inspiration to us all. With the other ex-commodores, who happily are still around and still contributing, they laid the foundations and guided us to where we are today.

And on that note, as they would have all wished, let us enjoy another great L.R.Y.C. Regatta.

NOTICE OF RACE

L.R.Y.C. ANNUAL REGATTA

5th – 11th August, 2017

The Organising Authority for this event is Lough Ree Yacht Club.

The Regatta will take place on Lough Ree and the River Shannon, based at the Club.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of the Irish National Authority (The ISA) will apply
- 1.3 All relevant class rules will apply.

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Competitor advertising will only be allowed if prior permission is sought and obtained in writing from the Regatta Committee.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the following classes: Cruiser, Shannon-One-Design, Optimist, Pico &/or RS Feva (Other class(es) may be added at the absolute discretion of the Regatta Committee).
- 3.2 Depending on the number of entries, the Organising Authority reserves the right to merge or subdivide any class, combine the starts of classes, or cancel racing for any class. A minimum entry of three boats per class will be required for a start.
- 3.3 All relevant Association dues, Club and entry fees must be paid, and declaration and registration forms duly completed in advance of a boat competing in the regatta.
- 3.4 Eligible boats may be entered by completing an entry form and sending it, together with the required fee, to Ms. Teresa Farrell, Balrose, Ballintubber, Rosemount, Moate, Co. Westmeath. N37 TK72. Entry Forms may be obtained by downloading from the Club's website www.lryc.ie
- 3.5 Entries will be accepted by post at the above address until Friday 4th August or thereafter only at registration (see 5.1).

4 FEES

4.1 Required fees are as follows:

- 4.2 Where entry forms and relevant fees are received by the Entries Secretary on or before Friday 28th July, 2017, a reduction of €30 will apply to each Family Race Entry subject to a maximum race entry fee per family membership of €260 (after discount).
- 4.3 Other fees relating to berthing, functions etc. are listed on the Regatta Entry Form.

5 SCHEDULE

5.1 Registration:

Registration will take place in the Clubhouse on:
Friday 4th August between 19.00 & 20.00,
Saturday 5th August between 10.00 & 12.00 and between 14.00 & 14.30.

5.2 Briefing

There will be a competitor briefing at the Clubhouse on Saturday 5th August at 09.30 followed by a junior briefing which will take place in the Junior Room over the new boathouse.

5.3 Racing

Racing is scheduled as set out in the Sailing Schedule (pages 4 - 8 of this document).

5.4 The warning signal for the first race on Saturday 5th August will be for Cruisers at 10.55, for Shannon-One- Designs 11.25 and for Optimists 11.45.

5.5 Races scheduled, with the exception of the first race for each class, may at the discretion of the Regatta Committee, be brought forward.

6 MEASUREMENTS

Each boat may be required to produce a valid measurement / rating certificate. In addition, all boats and equipment may be inspected during the Regatta to ensure compliance with Class Rules.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available at Registration (times listed above at 5.1).

8 THE COURSES

The courses for each race to be sailed will be indicated on the Course Board at the Clubhouse (Optimists, Old Boathouse) at least 30 minutes before the start.

9 BERTHING

Berthing spaces afloat and ashore will be allocated by the Beachmaster. Boats shall be berthed in those allocated spaces.

10 COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make transmissions while racing nor receive communications which are not available to all boats.

11 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as described in pages 5 – 9 of this document.

12 TROPHIES

Trophies are to be returned by arrangement to Eileen Browne at the start of the season. Phone: 087 237 1755. Engraving of trophies is the responsibility of competitors.

13 **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See *RRS 4*, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the regatta. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.

By taking part in the regatta, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

(a) they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the regatta.

(b) they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore and for their crew while racing.

(c) they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.

(d) their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the regatta and they are personally fit to participate.

(e) the provision of a race management team, rescue boats and other officials and volunteers does not relieve competitors of their own responsibilities.

(f) the provision of rescue boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

(g) The wearing of personal flotation devices is compulsory while racing. This changes *RRS 40*. It is strongly recommended that such devices be used at all times while afloat.

14 **INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate and valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of €3 million per incident or the equivalent (Junior Fleet €1.5 million).

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COURTESY NOTES

The Executive Committee has requested the Regatta Committee to draw your attention to the following matters.

TEMPORARY MEMBERSHIP

Visiting helmsmen and crew competing at the L.R.Y.C. Annual Regatta and their guests shall be Temporary Members of L.R.Y.C. for the duration of the Regatta and shall be bound by the rules of the club. The club reserves the right to withdraw Temporary Membership.

DOGS NOT PERMITTED

For reasons of health and safety, dogs are not permitted on Club property. Those members who feel they must bring their dogs, may keep them on their boats, removing them only on a lead to the nearest exit from Club property and returning them in the same manner.

ALCOHOL

Alcohol will not be served to persons under 18yrs of age. Under 15s are required by law to leave the bar area by 2100.

FOOD & DRINK

Soup and rolls will be available for sale at lunch time. Afternoon tea will be served daily. Members are reminded that only beverages purchased at the bar may be consumed in the Clubhouse and veranda area.
